SHOW ENTRY: \$20.00 per head, FOR BOTH SHOWS

GROUP CLASSES: FREE. To enter group classes, the animal must be entered in its respective class, in the show. Only animals entered in the show class are eligible for group classes.

Pen Fee: \$5.00 per pen, including tack pens. Pens must be cleaned upon departure.

Option: See office to have your pen cleaned for \$5.00 prior to leaving.

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

SHOWS: All shows are sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association and/or American Goat Society and its rules shall govern. All ADGA sanctioned shows are governed by their rules. Buttercup Classic rules are posted in this PDF.

All goats must be registered with the American Dairy Goat Association, American Goat Society, or the Canadian Goat Society. **ALL BLUE PAPERS ACCEPTED TO SHOW.**

The base dates for computing animal ages are June 3 (Youth Show), June 3 (Junior Does and Bucks) and June 3 (Senior Does).

ENTRY and FEES: All entries must be on the official entry form or entered through the form online, midwestbucksale.com. Entries must be postmarked on or before May 15, 2022 and must be accompanied by all entry fees.

No entry fees are required for Showmanship. Animal used in Showmanship must be entered in their respective class in the Buttercup Classic Show.

Group Classes are Free, but the animals entered in the group classes must have a paid entry in their respective class and show.

Entries postmarked after May 15 and received by June 1 will be accepted: an additional late fee of \$10 per animal will apply.

We do not accept telephone entries.

OWNER: Owner on the registration papers must be the youth exhibiting the animal. If more than one animal, owned by an exhibitor, in a class, a youth sibling or fellow 4-h, FFA member may help assist to exhibit. There are no exceptions. Entries must be in the name of the exhibitor only.

HOW TO ENTER: Go to midwestbucksale.com, click on the Dairy Goat Show page. On that page, there is a link to a form for parents/guardians to fill out. After the customer form is submitted, an email will go to the one put into the form. That form asks for the information on each child. Please submit that form. You may also go back to the show page and click on the link for the youth info form. Once that form is completed, you will get an email for the Youth Goat Camp or the Buttercup Classic Shows, or bottom depending on which events you selected when you signed up. If those links do not get emailed to you, return to that page again, and click on read where you may enter all of that information, through forms. The form information is important because this is our database for our events at the Midwest Buck Sale, in Sedalia. Once your information is in the database, it is easier to click and add what you want to enter. If there are any questions or issues, please email us at: midwestbucksale@gmail.com. We can email you or call you back and help.

We do not save your payment information and we do not ask for any personal info or passwords. Our forms are general information for the event purposes and we do not share or sell your information. It stays with us.

SUBSTITUTIONS: Exhibitors wishing to substitute animals must do so at check-in, or any time before. Substitutions made before May 25, 2022, are free of charge. Email: midwestbucksale@gmail.com and use the animal entry form, use the "notes" section to put in which animal you are substituting. Day of show substitutions: \$5.00 per animal.

CHECK IN: The original registration certificate is required for animals over 6 months of age; stamped duplicates are acceptable for animals under 6 months of age. Proof of animal's ownership is the name on the registration certificate or on the stamped duplicate. All animals entered in the Youth Show must be registered in the name of the youth. Group classes: Animals do not have to be owned by the same person, unless required in registry rules. They must be entered in their respective classes.

ARRIVALS: May 31, 2022, after 5:00pm (Youth Goat Camp)

Prior to unloading, you must be checked in with health papers. Pens are assigned. Pre-ordered shavings may be picked up at check in, paying at that time. Do not unload until you have been checked in.

HEALTH RULES: All animals entered in the Buttercup Classic Show must meet Missouri Importation Health requirements. An official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, signed by an accredited veterinarian, issued within 30 days of date of show, must accompany all animals. The certificate must list individual identification, a description of each animal, age, breed, and sex. All goats must be identified by registration numbers & tattoos. Unregistered animals must have a scrapie tag. **In addition, any goats originating in Canada must meet the USDA APHIS entry requirements.** Any animals appearing in poor health or displaying open abscesses or obvious signs of soremouth, ringworm, or pinkeye may not be shown and will be quarantined outside of the barn. We will have USDA veterinarians on premise. Please be sure your stock is in good health.

PENS: FEE IS \$5.00 per pen, per event. If you are in the Youth Goat Camp and pay for a pen, then enter the Buttercup Classic Show, there is a pen fee for each event. Please be sure to include the correct pen fees in your entry. Please preorder shavings on the website and pay at time of pick up on the grounds. **No hay or straw for bedding.** You may bring your own shavings. We provide a convenience if exhibitors want to preorder them. **PEN SIZE:** Pens are 42" tall, 7 x 7 ft. Pens have vertical metal bars and concrete floors. They hold 2-3 large breed or 3-4 miniature breed goats comfortably. Bring the necessary extras (ie: exercise panels, netting) for keeping small kids or jumpers in their pens. Please enter on the entry form the number of pens needed. Pens will be assigned. Please note if you want to be penned with someone.

TACK AREA: tack pens will be \$5.00. The end of the row is a good place for milk stands. Please keep aisles as clear as possible. If you have a lot to store, a tack pen may be necessary to keep the isles clean. **If you need more room, please include a tack pen.**

NOTICE: PLEASE DO NOT MOVE PANELS UNLESS YOU RETURN THEM TO WHERE THEY WERE PRIOR TO LEAVING. ANY PANELS MOVED and NOT PUT BACK IN PLACE, WILL BE CHARGED TO THE EXHIBITOR. If you move panels, please put them back prior to your departure. **If panels are not back in place, the state fairgrounds WILL charge us for all panels moved.** The exhibitor will be charged \$10.00 per panel, if the fairgrounds charges the Midwest Buck Sale, LLC, you will be responsible for your pens. Please be sure they look the same when you depart, as they did when you arrived. This includes cleaning. **Pens must be cleaned.** If you want to pay a youth to clean them, \$5.00 per pen, please come to the office and sign up. Pay Cash please. This helps keep costs low. We appreciate everyone's help and cooperation in keeping the building clean.

MILKOUT: No mandatory pre-show milk-out. Please, **DO NOT over udder your does.** Please dispose of milk only in designated areas.

All ads must be received by May 15th.

PROGRAMS: Each exhibitor will receive a program. Additional programs are \$5.00 each. Please preorder so we know how many to print. Programs will also be available for purchase at the show.

FOOD: There are many fine restaurants in Sedalia. Your welcome packet will have suggestions, ideas, and coupons for local eateries. Please do not use any type of cooking pots or anything with an open flame. It is strictly prohibited in the building, by the state fairgrounds.

LODGING: Go to: midwestbucksale.com/information/ there is a list of available hotels. We do not have a host hotel. Make your reservations early.

CAMPING: Camping is available on the fairgrounds. Go to the information page on the website for details. No reservations needed. Missouri State Fairgrounds employees will collect fees. You may want to call ahead for prices.

PRIVATE TREATY: Private Treaty Sales on the grounds are strictly prohibited. The Midwest Buck Sale invites breeders of quality production stock, to enter their animals in the Sale, June 4, 2022, at 4:00 pm (subject to change).

Please do not bring animals on the grounds that are not showing or entered in the sale. Details for the sale are on the website under the Sale Information page.

VET SERVICES: There will be state veterinarians on the grounds all week, along with the USDA. If you need a veterinary service, please call a local veterinarian to arrange treatment. All veterinarian costs are between the animal owner and the veterinarian.

RAFFLE: Buck Alley is our 50/50 raffle to raise funds for the Youth Goat Camp. Enter your buck in Buck Alley and then get your friends to vote. Buck owners win prizes and a lucky ticket winner wins half the pot. It is a lot of fun! Midwestbucksale.com/ and click on the 'Buck Alley' page.

SILENT AUCTION: Silent auction will be set up near the office. Donated items are welcome: Books, Baskets, Jams, Jellies, State related stuff, Buckets, Grooming Items, Semen, Collars, Leads, AI Equipment, and anything you may think of that will raise funds for the Youth events.

MISC: No smoking in the pavilion. No Cooking or open flame of any sort is permitted within any building. All exits shall remain free and clear at all times. Please keep the grounds and buildings clean. Used bedding to be disposed of in the designated area.

Dogs must be in a cage or inside a pen, out of sight.

Please dress appropriately for the ring: the standard dress code of show whites or white shirt and black pants will be enforced.

Grievances: Must be filed with the appropriate sanctioning body. Judges decisions will be final.

BUTTERCUP CLASSIC YOUTH SHOW

1. AGS and ADGA rules will Govern the AGS Youth Show 6/3/2022 starting at 5:30 PM
2. ADGA rules shall govern the ADGA/AGS dual sanctioned Shows.
3. The show order is subject to change at the Judge's and Show Chair's discretion.
4. All Nigerians will be measured as they enter the ring. Over height animals will not show.
5. **NO DOGS allowed** in the show area OR where goats are being housed, loaded, or unloaded. Dogs are allowed on the grounds and must be on a leash, in a cage and/or in a pen. **Service Dogs** must be approved by the show staff prior to arrival. They must have current and valid certification on your person. Dogs must always remain in the pen and out of sight. Failure to comply with this rule, owner will be asked to remove the dog(s) from grounds.
6. It is expected that exhibitors respect the animals and property of others.
7. Parking will be in the designated parking area, no parking will be allowed next to the Swine Pavilion, or under the building. Do not park on the grass.
8. State Health Papers are required for in-state and out of state animals. Animals must be in good health, **any animals with lumps or abscesses should remain home. Animals with abscesses or visible illnesses will not be allowed to show and will need to be removed from the grounds immediately. Show fees will not be returned.** Sick or injured goats will be asked to be kept on trailer.
9. **Exhibitors are responsible** for providing current, original certificates of registration and accuracy of any ROA. **No photocopies or printed materials accepted. No refunds.**
